## Church of St. James, Selham, West Sussex.

- 1. The church from the NW. Some evidence in the NW lower quoins of long-and-short work (the west wall rebuilt later).
- 2. Chancel arch from the nave.
- 3. Nave, and chancel beyond, the random rubble of the walling seen from the NW (that of the chancel partly coursed).
- 4. The N doorway to nave.
- 5. South capital, chancel arch, seen from the west (& see pic 7), scrolls and monsters.
- 6. North capital, chancel arch both Saxon and Roman, the impost is a reused Roman fragment, obvious in its (truncated) classical section (see Taylor & Taylor).
- 7. South capital seen again here, strange in its 'tiered' top heavy effect, it is actually deeper in height than its sister (possibly reusing existing worked stones).
